



	<p>Those persons involved included all stakeholders, parents, administrators and staff. The ways they were involved were collaboratively analyzing all of the current data for Low. The goals were read and discussed. The plan is presently in its draft stage and is being reviewed By Title I.</p> <p>CCRPI School Climate Report We involved stakeholders in the development of the school-wide plan by seeking verbal feedback, collecting parent surveys, and engaging them in a variety of planning meeting sessions. We will be coming up with some creative means to get 100% participation on the surveys. Our CCRPI score went from 51.7 to 53.9. Because we do not offer specialty programs there are some points that we cannot earn (World Language, STEM, Band, etc.). Science and Social Studies will not be included in the CCRPI score this year.</p> <p>Flex & Intercession The teachers will be having two PLCs on small group instruction. Our Flex/Intercession block allows our students to receive a double dose of instruction on skills they need to improve upon or enrichment. The teachers will now be using MobyMax, STAR Reading/Math for progress monitoring.</p>		
NEW BUSINESS:	<p>Our Parent facilitator, Mrs. Grant was introduced to the council by Ms. West. She made the council aware of our new business partners- Enmarket, Food Lion, Lucky's Market, and Aaron's. Also, Ms. Grant spoke about the National Million Father March that will take place on the 19th of September.</p> <p>Mr. Brannen suggested the use of bicycle incentives be used for attendance.</p> <p>Ms. Brown, our former Pre-K teacher is now our Behavior Intervention Teacher. She will focus on managing anger and behavior. (Targeted students are 2nd and 4th graders)</p>
