*The New Options Waiver (NOW) and the Community Habilitation and the Comprehensive Supports Waiver Program (COMP) offer home and community-based services for people with mental retardation or developmental disabilities. A diagnosis of developmental disability includes mental retardation or other closely-related conditions such as cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism or neurological problems that require a level of care provided in an intermediate care facility for people who have mental retardation. In order to qualify for the waiver programs, the individual must first meet the criteria for Medicaid payment in an institution and certain other criteria. The person is then offered the choice between community-based services or institutional care as long as the community services do not cost more than the institutional care.*

*The NOW Waiver Program enables individuals with less intense and urgent needs than out-of-home residential treatment or extensive waiver services to live independently in the community. Goals for participants in the NOW Waiver Program include:*

- *Increasing the independence and quality of life for people with*

## DEPARTMENT FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN ▼ PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

### **Autism (AUT)**

This program serves students with diagnoses of autism from the preschool level through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. The level of severity and the individualized needs of each student are utilized to determine which of our uniquely developed programs are appropriate and provide Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) for our students.

- The department's **Transition Programs** serve students with mild degrees of autism who will benefit from supports provided in the general education environment and will be able to generalize those learned skills without continuous physical supports.
- The **Jumpstart Program** serves pre-school aged students diagnosed/identified with autism.
- **LEAP (Language Enriched Alternative Program)** classes are similar to the Jumpstart Program but serve students in grades K-2.

### **Deaf/Hard of Hearing (D/HOH) Hearing Impaired (HI)**

The program for students who are deaf or hard of hearing provides academic and social skills instruction necessary for productive functioning in a hearing society as follows:

- Sign language when appropriate
- Interpreters for those students who attend regular education classes
- Hearing aid monitoring as well as instruction in the care of hearing aids.

### **Emotional and Behavioral Disorders (EBD)**

The program for students with emotional and behavior disorders provides services for students whose emotional and/or behavioral functioning interferes significantly with their educational performance. The goals of the program include:

- Providing structured learning environments
- Helping students participate successfully in mainstreamed settings
- Helping students replace negative behaviors with positive behaviors.

### **Mild Intellectual Disabilities (MID)**

The program for students with mild intellectual disabilities enables students to develop individual

skills to their highest potential, enhance their self concept, and become self-sustaining citizens. The goals of the program are to assist students in acquiring and improving:

- Functional academic skills
- Social skills
- Daily living skills
- Vocational skills.

### **Moderate Intellectual Disabilities (MOID)**

The program for moderate intellectual disabilities is designed to increase basic skill development and social and community functioning for identified students. The goals for this program include:

- Enabling students to grow personally, socially, and emotionally
- Providing an individualized curriculum
- Building daily living and communication skills
- Enhancing cognitive, motor, social, prevocational and vocational skills.

### **Preschool Intervention (PSI)**

This program serves disabled children ages 3-5. The multidisciplinary curriculum and developmentally appropriate strategies provide an instructional program for all children based on their individual needs. Preschool screening is conducted with the purpose of identifying potential health, development, and educational problems.

The program focuses on the following:

- Helping young children with special needs to grow toward independence and to strive for maximum potential in physical, social, cognitive, communicative, and self-help areas
- Assisting parents in becoming more proficient with goal setting and behavior training techniques
- Offering support to parents through conferences, parent group meetings, and activity oriented workshops.

### **Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD)**

The program for students with specific learning disabilities serves students with average or above average intelligence who exhibit a disorder in one or more of the basic learning processes involved in understanding or in using spoken and written language. The goals of the program include:

- Helping students achieve grade appropriate skills
- Teaching students strategies for compensating for processing deficits.

### **Speech/Language Impaired (SI)**

The speech/language program provides professional comprehensive services designed to achieve competence in communication for the student with speech-language impairments. Speech/language pathologists provide consultative, diagnostic, therapeutic, and augmentative communication services to students ages 3 through 21. This program serves eligible students with communication impairments in at least one of the following areas:

- Articulation
- Voice
- Fluency
- Language.

### **Severe/Profound Intellectual Disabilities (SID/PID)**

This program enables severe and profoundly intellectually disabled students to realize their full academic potential in the personal, social, physical, cognitive, and vocational domains. Students in this program receive individualized, comprehensive, and intensive training in the following areas:

- Communication
- Motor development
- Daily living
- Functional academics
- Sensory stimulation
- Home living
- Art, music, physical education
- Vocational.

### **Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)**

This category is designed to address the academic needs of students diagnosed with traumatic brain impairment.

### **Visually Impaired/Blind (VI)**

The program for students who are visually impaired/blind assists students in preparing for life in their community.

The program provides the following instruction:

- Supports students in general education by enlarging materials, providing large print textbooks, Braille, and oral instruction
- Mobility training when appropriate
- Assistance and training in daily living skills.

### **Other Health Impaired (OHI)**

Other Health Impaired is a category for students who have chronic or acute health problems which adversely affect their education performance.

### **Related Services**

Related services include transportation and other developmental, corrective and such support services as required to assist a disabled child to benefit from special education. Services include, but are not limited to:

The vocational program supports performance goals for continuous improvement to include:

- Decreasing dropout rate
- Increasing regular diploma rate
- Graduated and attending post secondary education
- Graduated and employed.

- Transitioning students beginning at age 14 with the intent of directing students towards activities which will enhance opportunities upon exiting school.

CliffsNotes has information for grades 7 and up on many subjects, including basic French, Spanish, and 10 sciences. The glossary of terms that's available for several of the subjects should make decoding homework easier for kids and parents alike.

This site was able to provide only a basic review of the subject matter and has a dictionary, thesaurus, almanac, and atlas. This site's science section covers lots of topics for high school students, including earth, life, physical, and computer sciences, but with little depth. The math portion contains helpful information for elementary school students, focusing on skills like measurements and money, and the English section includes good tips on writing a paper for older kids.

#### [sparknotes.com](http://sparknotes.com)

Geared toward high schoolers, SparkNotes is a bit limited: The site has a math section (touching on subjects from pre-algebra to calculus BC) and short biology, chemistry, and physics sections for science, and the only English materials are on the site's "SparkCharts." SparkNotes' quizzes reinforce material and pinpoint areas in need of review. Overall, this is a fine tutorial site for students looking for a short, simple review.

#### [factmonster.com](http://factmonster.com)

Factmonster is a good choice for students ages 8 to 14 looking to find information. The math portion covers simple topics like measurements and fractions, the science section touches on everything from dinosaurs to food, and the English section (called "Word Wise") includes explanations of grammar and usage. It has an encyclopedia, dictionary, almanac, and atlas, as well as fairly decent examples of science theories and math problems, games, and quizzes.

The site also loads very fast, and both its display and text are relatively easy to read.

GrammarBook is more of a guidebook for middle and high school students wanting to know the correct mechanics of writing. The grammar rules that are provided are helpful and clear; the information comes from the *Chicago Manual of Style*, a credible source for many types of writing.

### McKinney-Vento Homeless Program

*The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act is the federal law that governs the educational rights of children and youth in homeless situations. This act was reauthorized in 2001 as Title X Part C, No Child Left Behind Act. Homeless children have the right to a free, appropriate public education*

#### A student is homeless if they:

- live in a shelter or transitional housing
- live in a motel, campground, car, abandoned building or on the streets
- share the housing of friends or relatives due to loss of housing (eviction and foreclosure) or cannot afford housing
- have a temporary foster care placement

#### Students who are homeless have the right to:

- immediately enroll in and attend school without having health or school records and a permanent address
- continue to attend the school they attended before becoming homeless...if in your child's best interest or attend the school in the attendance zone where they are currently living
- receive transportation to and from the school of origin
- participate in school activities for which they are eligible

### School Social Workers

*School Social Workers work with students and families to eliminate barriers to successful learning. They serve as a liaison or link between school, home and community.*

**Services:** School Social Workers consult with teachers, attend or arrange student/parent conferences, make home visits, participate in Student Support Teams (SST's) and/or Special Education eligibility meetings, conduct group work with students/parents, consult with numerous community agencies such as Department of Family & Children Services (DFCS), the Court System and Mental Health and Physical Health Providers.

School Social Workers organize food drives, develop needed resources such as coat closets or school supply closets, participate in truancy round ups, provide crisis intervention and grief counseling and coordinate and obtain eye exams for students whose families cannot afford them.

*School Social Workers also assist in the provision of services to Homeless students as required by the McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Act. School Social Workers' additional duties include, but are not limited to:*

- Assisting students/families with accessing medical insurance/healthcare.
- Assisting students/families with obtaining expensive medications.
- Advocating in EIP meetings, RTI meetings, and other meetings on behalf of students who may be eligible for early intervention or special education services.
- Facilitating individual and group sessions to promote student resiliency.

The crisis stabilization program is designed to serve as a first line alternative to hospitalization in state hospitals.*

### **The Crisis Stabilization Program:**

- Serve consumers who are experiencing an acute psychiatric crisis for which outpatient services are insufficient and more restrictive care is necessary.
- Provide a community-based alternative to hospitalization where continuous and integrated services are available to meet the needs of the consumer and his/her family
- Provide immediate crisis stabilization services to prevent likely worsening of symptoms both for consumers with initial crisis and for current consumers requiring a more intensive level of care.
- Provide a community-based service that links with other community agencies, including the judicial system, DFCS, local health departments and hospitals, and other mental health providers in meeting the holistic needs of the consumer.
- Initiate integration of services to further stabilize the consumer's condition and prepare him/her for transfer to an alternative level of care.

### **Target Populations**

*Population served in the Crisis Stabilization Program: children and adolescents ages 5-17 requiring psychiatric, behavioral stabilization; and adolescents ages 13-17 with substance related disorders or with co-occurring mental illness and substance abuse needs. Youth through age 21 may be served at the CSP provided it is clinically indicated and is based on the youth's maturational age.*

### **Crisis Services**

*The CSP provides crisis services twenty-four hours per day seven days a week. Potential consumers may access after hour crisis services by calling 912-330-8335 during regular working hours Monday through Friday. The crisis hotline is forwarded to the CSP from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. on weekdays, holidays and 5:00 p.m. Friday, to 8:00 a.m. Monday.*

**Laboratory Services:** All consumers admitted must have routine lab tests, complete blood count, chemistry profile, RPR, urinalysis, urine drug screen, tuberculin skin test, and pregnancy test for females age 11 and over.

**Class Room Education:** During his/her admission each child/adolescent will receive classroom education services provided by certified teachers and instructors. Upon discharge documentation of this education will be forwarded to his/her home school.
