**Executive Summary: Student Well Being
SY 2014-15**

About Student Well-Being

Each year, the Georgia Student Health Survey II is administered state-wide to students in grades 6-12. The survey consists of over 100 items that cover a variety of topics related to students' behaviors, health, and perceptions of their school environment. From the Student Health Survey, SCCPSS has identified a subset of 24 key items that provide an indicator of students' overall physical, psychological, and social well-being.

Data reflected in the following report is derived from the student-level survey data file provided by the Georgia Department of Education. No identifying student information is collected, so the survey responses are anonymous. Well-being data is reported as the percentage of responses that are indicative of positive well-being. Note, the 2015 version of the Georgia Student Health Survey II was revised to update wording on some items and to omit other items that were included in surveys during previous years; therefore, results from 2013 and 2014 may not be comparable.

Highlights related to 2014-15 student well-being include:

- Seventy-nine (79) percent of all survey responses indicated positive student well-being. K8 schools achieved an 80% well-being rate, while middle schools and high schools were at 79%.
- Across all grade levels, psychological well-being was rated higher than physical and social wellbeing--82%, 79% and 75%, respectively.
- Positive well-being rates were similar for males and females, 80% and 79%, respectively.
- Positive well-being ranged from a high of 81% among students who described themselves as Black to a low of 76% among students who identified with an ethnic group other than Asian, Black, Hispanic, or White.
- Overall school-level well-being rates ranged from 70% to 86%, with Woodville-Tompkins having the highest Overall Well-Being rate (86%) followed by Bartlett STEM Academy, Oglethorpe, Beach, and Savannah Arts with 85% each.



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Figure 1: Percentage of Responses Indicating Positive Well Being: By Level

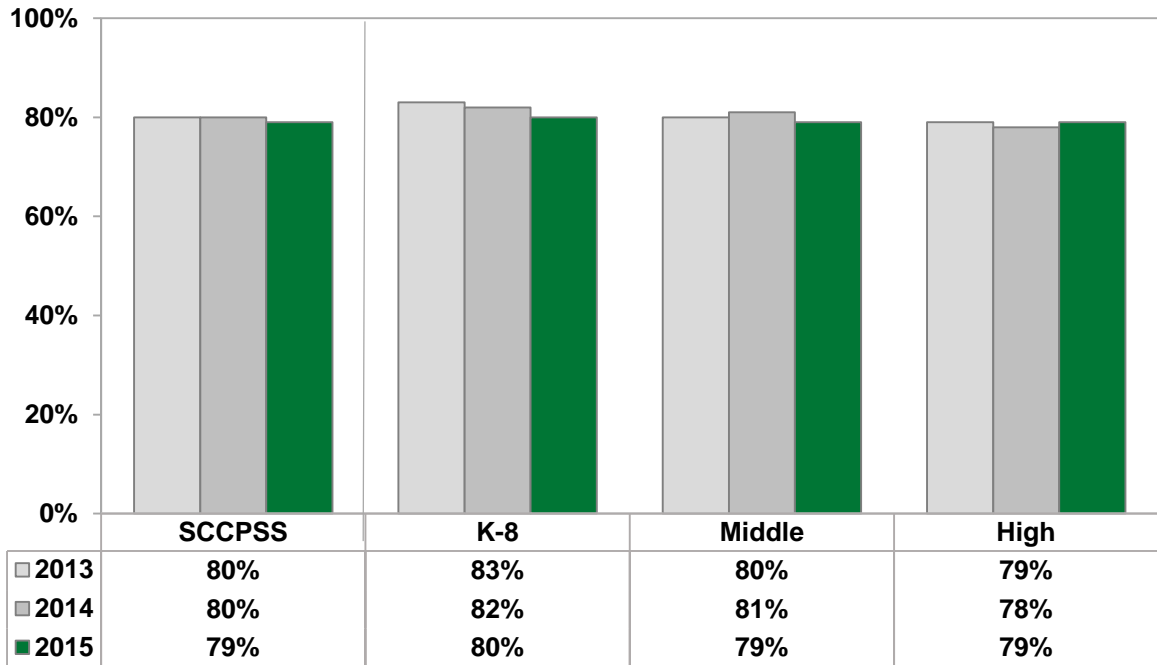
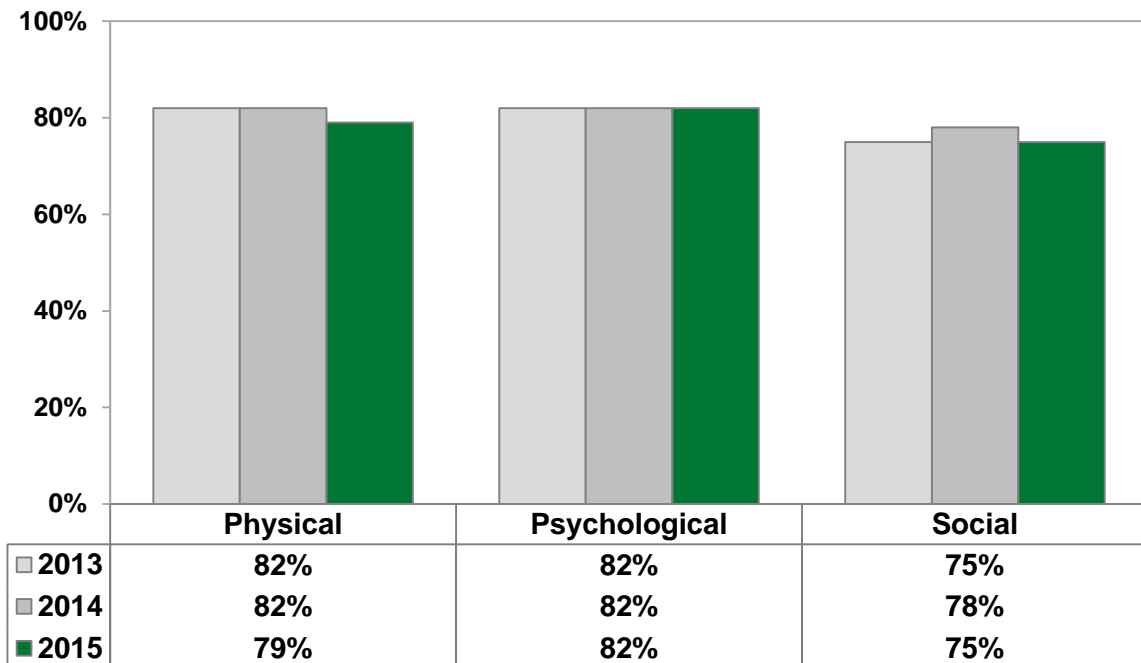


Figure 2: Percentage of Responses Indicating Positive Well-Being: By Domain
