About the Climate Survey

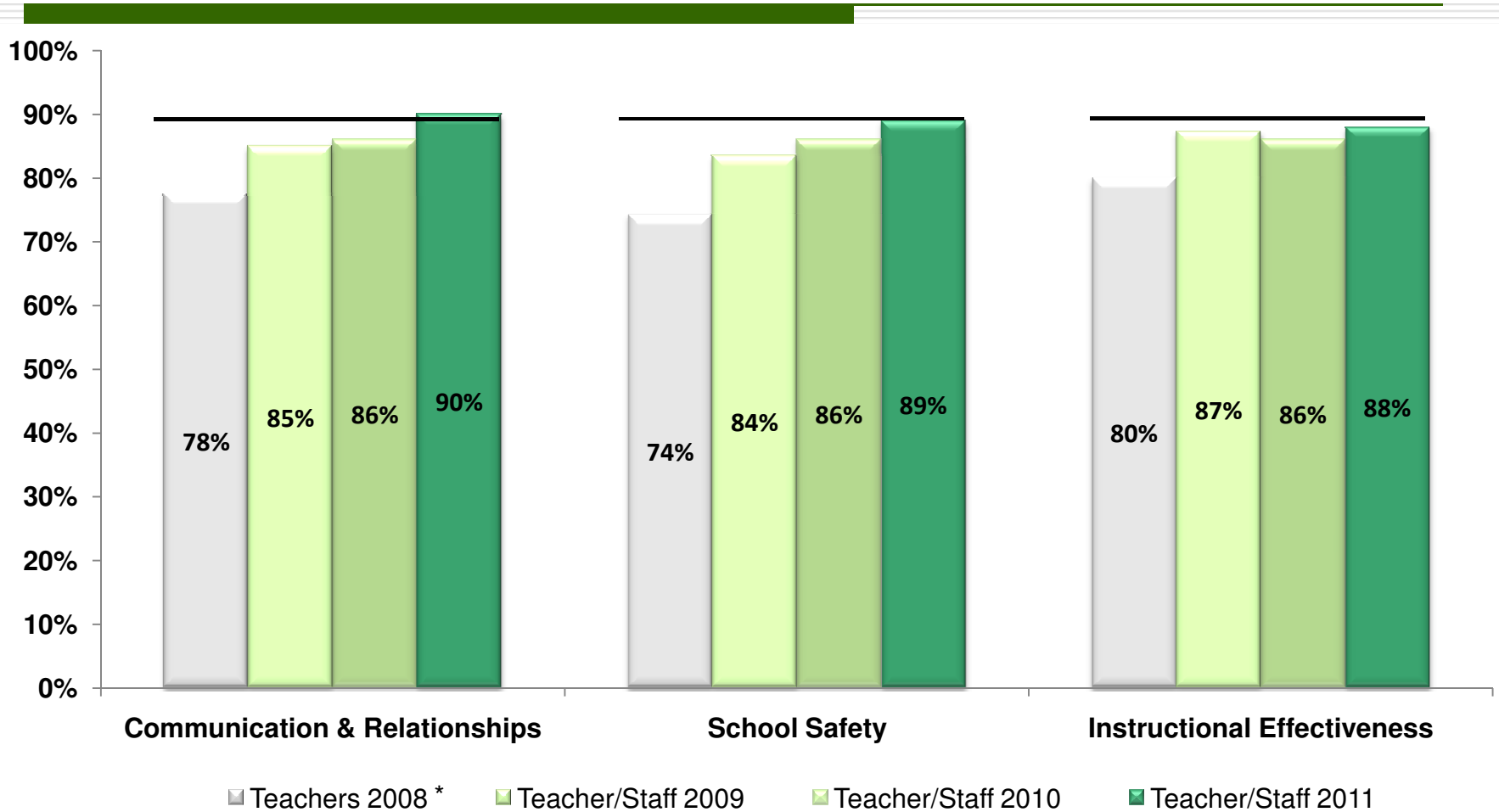
- Began in SY 2007-08, expanded in subsequent years

Percentage of Teachers & Support Personnel Reporting Positive Perceptions of their High School/Other Ed Center: 2011

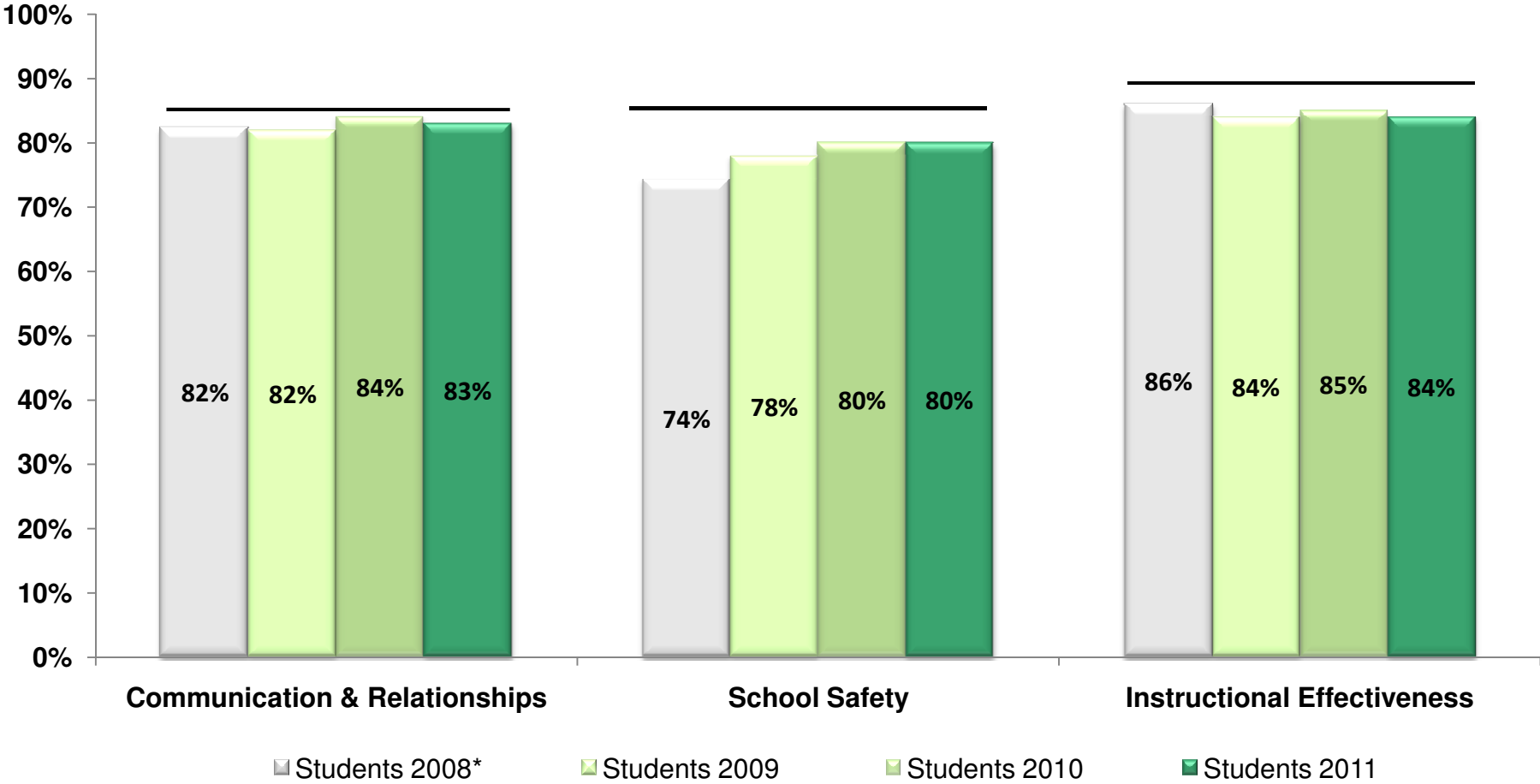

Percentage of Students Reporting Positive Perceptions of their High School/Other Ed Center: 2011

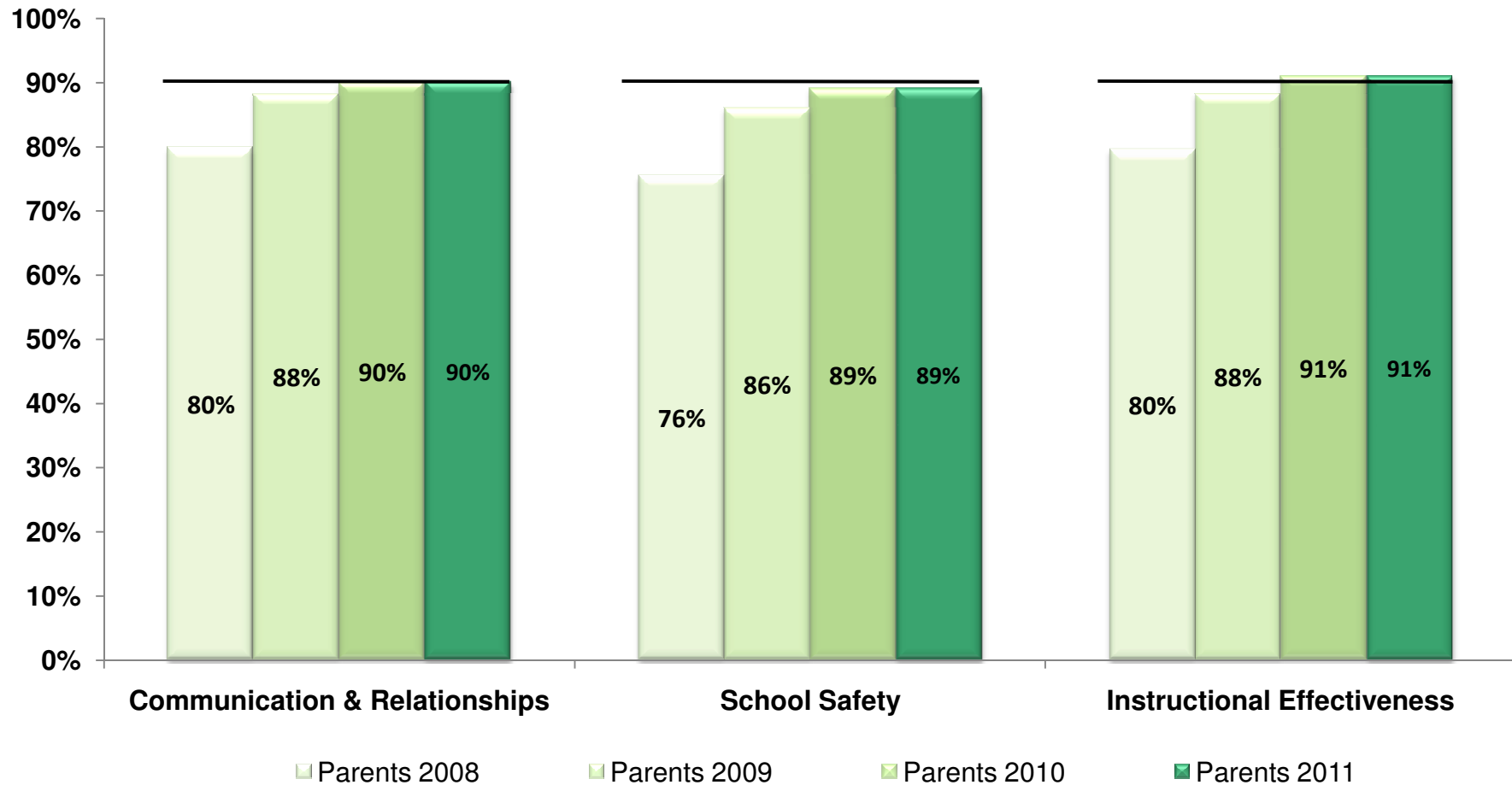

Actions

- ❑ Redesigning the Code of Conduct to improve communication and school safety at all levels
- ❑ Continuing to implement PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports) with focus on expanding among middle schools
- ❑ Introduction of Character Counts in elementary and middle schools to ensure staff teach and model the six pillars of character

The Story Behind the Numbers

Since the inception of the Climate Surveys, results have been used for school improvement & incorporated into School Accountability Plans. We have taken the following steps to ensure that schools receive actionable data:

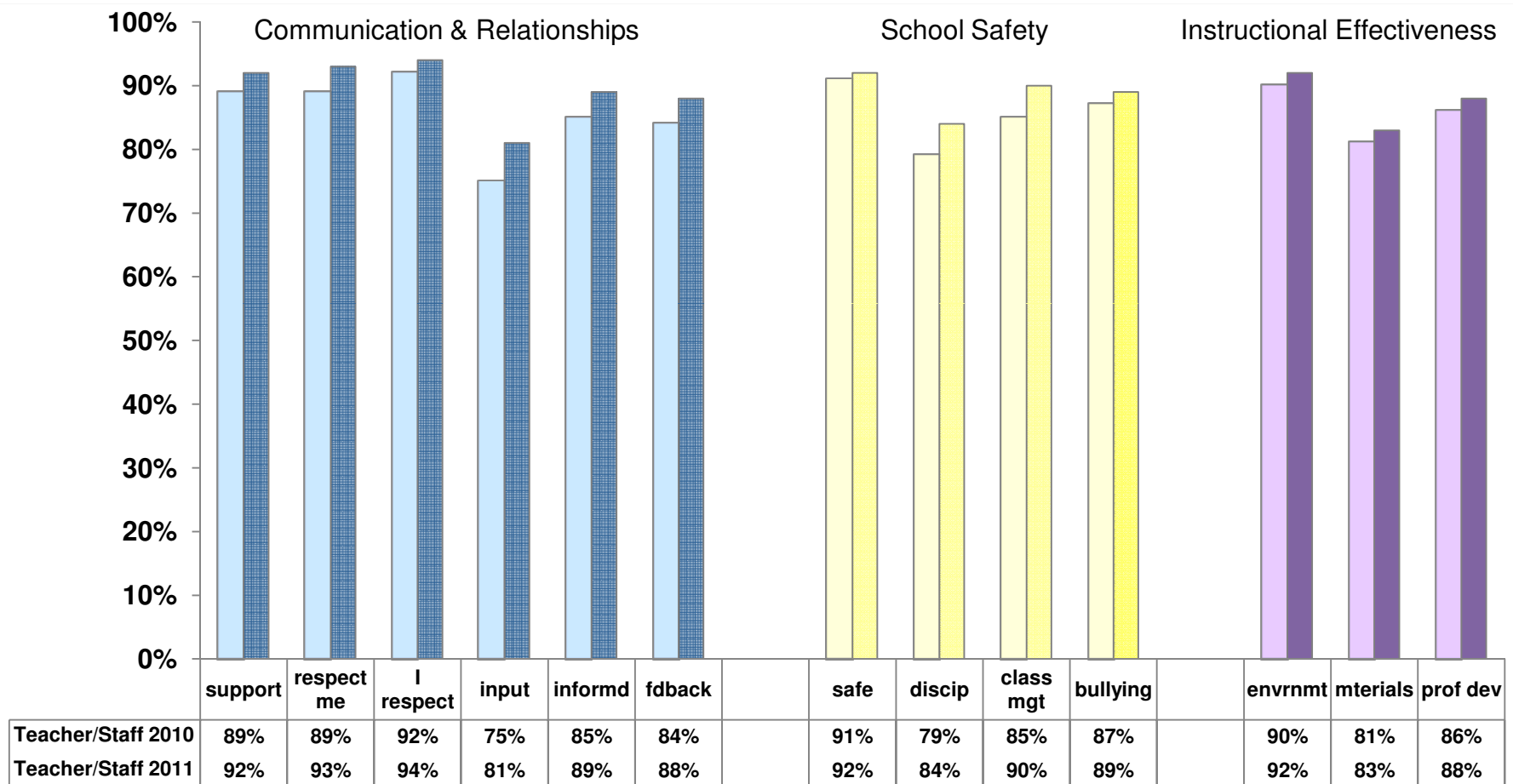
- ❑ Schools are provided item-level summary data to help identify and target specific areas of strength and weakness
- ❑ Timing of the survey was changed to allow principals to receive results and take action within the current year
- ❑ Paper surveys were implemented to increase parent participation in under-represented schools
- ❑ District call-outs & press releases are combined with principals' efforts to increase participation in the online surveys

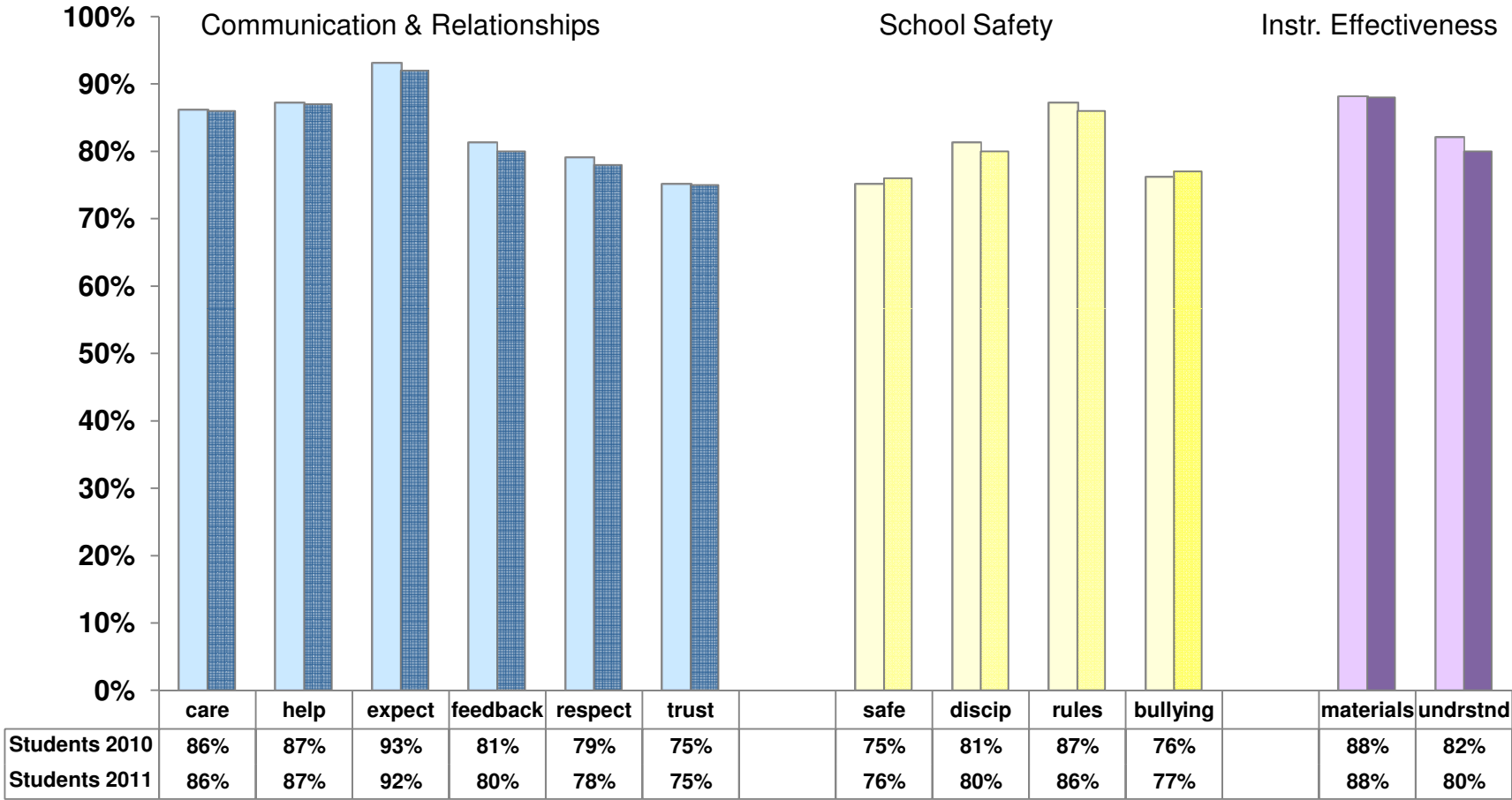


Percentage of Teachers & Staff Reporting Positive Perceptions of Their School: By Item



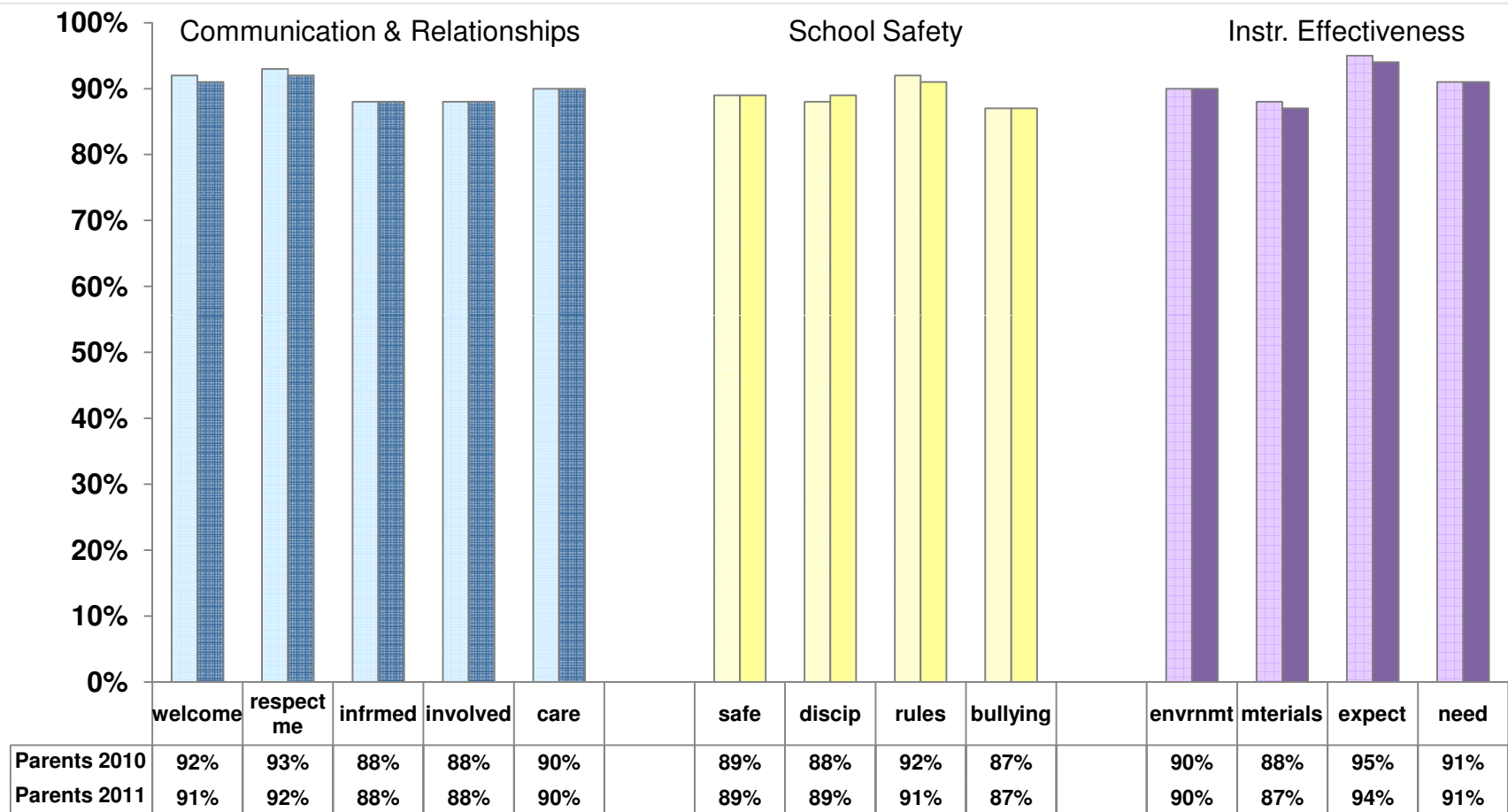
Note: Light to dark gradation of color represents progression of years from 2010 to 2011

Criteria

- Teacher/Staff and Student results are reported from data gathered by the online survey system
- Parent results are reported from data gathered by the online survey system, combined with data scanned from paper surveys
- Participation numbers are based on those who responded to at least one survey item
- Comprehensive domain results are computed based on the average of the domain items
