Executive Summary Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS) School Year 2012-2013

About the ITBS

The ITBS is nationally normed and administered throughout the country. It includes separate assessments in the areas of reading, language, mathematics, social studies, science, and sources of information. The test also provides an overall measure of achievement referred to as the composite score.

All scores presented in this report are expressed as national percentile ranks - not to be confused with percent correct scores. The national percentile ranks reported here indicate how well a typical student within a particular grade performed relative to a representative national sample of students taking this test during the midyear of 2000 (the norm group). The 50th percentile, the score that divides the upper and lower half of the scores, represents the national average, while scores between the 25th and 75th percentile represent the average range. Scores below the 25th percentile or above the 75th percentile are considered to be below or above average, respectively.

The lowa Tests of Basic Skills were administered to students in grades 3, 5, and 8 during the month of October 2012. Results for the Fall 2012 administration of the ITBS are summarized in tables shown below. To assist the reader in the use of this report, the scores at or above the national average (50th percentile) are highlighted in blue. There are several schools that have met or exceeded the average national percentile rank.

Highlights of the 2012-2013 ITBS include:

- Eighth grade students posted one-year gains in reading, social studies, and science while maintaining the 2011 percentile rank in both language (46) and math (42).
- Fifth grade students posted one-year gains in all subjects except language where they maintained a 50 percentile rank from 2011.
- Third grade students posted a one-year gain in science and maintained the 2011 percentile rank in reading (46) and social studies (56).

Actions

A recommendation is being made that the district discontinue the administration of the ITBS. The rationale for this action is based on the following:

Norming Comparison

- ITBS provides a comparison of how students perform relative to other students in a nationally normed sample group.
- The district currently uses SRI-Lexile (Reading) and NWEA-MAP (Math) that also provide a comparison of how students perform relative to other students in a nationally normed sample group.

Frequency Comparison

- ITBS provides a once-a-year snapshot of student performance in three grade levels (grades 3, 5, and 8).
- NWEA-MAP and SRI-Lexile are administered three times a year (September, January, and May) to students in grades 2-8.
 - These assessments provide opportunities for student progress monitoring.
 - In addition, they provide teachers with data for assessing student growth and adjusting instruction.

Cost Comparison for SY2013

- ITBS serves 8,270 students in grades 3, 5, and 8, once a year. Per student/per assessment cost of \$6.68 (Locally funded). Administered using booklets and scoring sheets.
- MAP serves 20,036 students three times a year. Per student/per assessment cost of \$2.33 (RT3 funded). Administered online.
- SRI also serves 20,036 students three times a year. Per student/per assessment cost of \$1.67 (RT3 funded). Administered online.

Assessments and progress monitoring tools used by the district:

- NWEA MAP* (Measurement of Academic Progress)-math-grades 2-8
- SRI Lexile* (Scholastic Reading Inventory)-reading-grades 2-8
- mCLASS DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills)-readinggrades K-1
- mCLASS Math grades K-1
- OAS (Online Assessment System) science-grades 3-8
- District Common Assessments social studies grades 4, 5, 8
- SLO (Student Learning Objectives) K-12 non-tested subjects

Removal of ITBS would recover five instructional days for students in grades 3, 5, and 8.

Furthermore, NWEA-MAP provides seamless integration with Compass Learning-Odyssey.

 Compass Learning-Odyssey is an online intervention tool that provides teachers, parents, and students with differentiated activities based on students' areas of strength and weakness.


