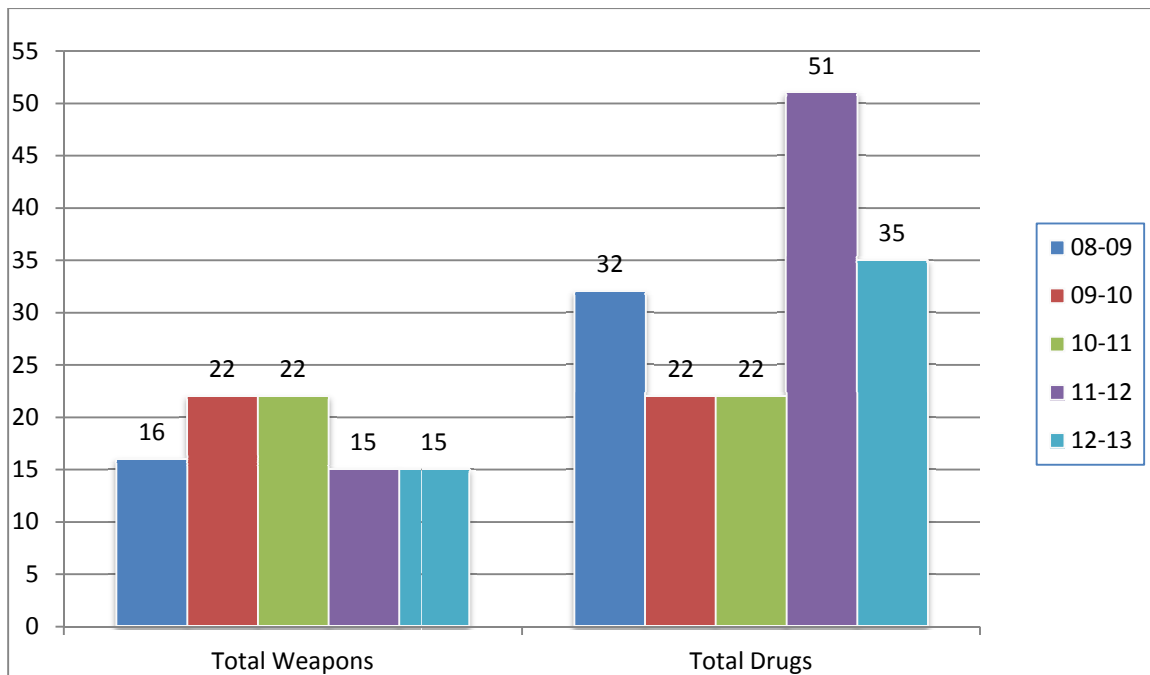
Objective D: Weapons and Drugs

Third Quarter Report: 2012-2013 School Year

Executive Summary

In accordance with Strategic Objective 3D, the district is to reduce the number of Weapons and Drugs on school campuses as measured by official police reports to 45 or less in each category by FY 2014. For the period of January 1, 2013 through March 31, 2013 there have been 35 incidents involving drug violations and 15 incidents involving weapons violations. With an emphasis on Strategic Objective 3D, we are ensuring that a minimum of 3 Random Administrative Inspections are done per school every week. There has been a significant decrease in weapons as compared to the third quarter of FY2012 and no increase in drug violations. The Random Administrative Inspections and continued Safe School Searches are a part of the normal routine of all schools, thus providing a major deterrent for students looking to bring weapons and/or drugs onto school grounds.

3rd Quarter Drugs and Weapons Comparison



Attached is a breakdown of drug and weapons violations by elementary, K-8, middle, high and alternative schools for FY13 for the period of January 1, 2013 through March 31, 2013.

Drug violations are viewed under four areas of the official criminal code of the State of Georgia:

- OCGA 16-13-30 Purchase, possession, manufacture, distribution, or sale of controlled substances or marijuana.
- OCGA 16-13-30 (a) Purchase, possess, or have under control any controlled substance.
- OCGA 16-13-30 (j) Possession, have under control, manufacture, deliver, distribute, dispense, administer, purchase, sell, or possess with intent to distribute marijuana.
- OCGA 16-13-32.4 Manufacturing, distributing, dispensing, or possessing with intent to distribute controlled substances in, on, or near public or private schools

Weapons are viewed under the following official criminal code of the State of Georgia:

- OCGA 16-11-127.1 Carrying weapons within school safety zones, at school functions, or on school property.
