DAS Discipline Report (1st Semester) School Year 2014-2015

Discipline

The district objective is to reduce the number of infractions that give rise to referrals for In School Suspension (ISS), Out of School Suspension (OSS), and expulsion from the baseline for school year 2012-2013 of 14,147 to less than or equal to 11,500 by SY 2016-17. Students who are long-term suspended or expelled may be placed in an alternative program.


Following are definitions of the discipline terminology:

- Infraction The action that is in violation of the Student Code of Conduct
- Disposition The result of a disciplinary action
- Referral A document that lists the infraction and disciplinary action
- In-School Suspension (ISS) Short-term removal of a student from the classroom
- Out-of-School Suspension (OSS) Short-term removal of a student from the school, ten days or less
- Long-Term Suspension Long-term removal of a student from the school for more than ten days
- Alternative Placement Long-term removal of a student from the school beyond the school quarter or semester
- Expulsion Removal of the student from the system without academic support.
- Enrollment Includes students who enrolled in any school during the term August 7, 2014 to December 19, 2014.

Highlights


- District wide, elementary and middle school total infractions decreased from SY2014 to SY2015 in the first semester.
- First semester decrease from SY2012 to SY2015 (4 year span) occurred at Beach High with 414 students in SY2012 to 141 students in SY2015 and at Windsor Forest High with 430 students in SY2012 to 129 students in SY2015.
- First semester decrease from SY2013 to SY2015 (3 year span) occurred at Garden City, Gould, Shuman, STEM Academy, and Islands.
- First semester decrease from SY2014 to SY2015 occurred at Brock, Butler, Howard, Low, Southwest ES, Spencer, Thunderbolt, Windsor Forest ES, Godley Station, Hesse, Isle of Hope, Myers, Southwest MS, Jenkins, Savannah Arts, and Woodville-Tompkins.

Total Infractions Which Led to OSS/ISS/Expulsion by Level




Total Infractions Which Led to OSS/ISS/Expulsion
