As a part of the SCCPSS, Gadsden Elementary takes part in the Balanced Literacy (BL) and Go Math (GM) initiatives. BL uses both whole language and phonics. The goal of BL is to include the strongest elements of each. Go Math connects math to the real world in ways that take the fear out of math and build student confidence. All students in grades K-5 will be taught the Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE) with expected mastery and assessed with MAP three times per year. Students in grades 3-5 will take the GMAS at the end of the year.

Jointly Developed Partnership

Gadsden Elementary believes that family engagement means the participation of families in regular two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring:

- That parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning.
- That families are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school.
- That families are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.
- The carrying out of other activities as described in the plan.
- That families are involved in the decisions regarding the 1% funds allocated for family engagement, by completing surveys and providing feedback / input during the annual Family Forum . The school collects feedback and input to make decisions on the budget.

What is Title I?

School Policy for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a policy that describes how Gadsden Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Gadsden Elementary values the contributions and engagement of parents and families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it revised?

Gadsden Elementary invites all parents and families to attend our Family Forum, held annually each spring to provide input on the development of this policy. Gadsden Elementary believes in building ties between home and school is key to student success. Gadsden Elementary will work to implement and coordinate family programs to strengthen the student outcomes, parent supports, and the larger Gadsden Elementary community.

Gadsden Elementary School's Principal will submit to the district Title I office via email any comments of parents who feel the schoolwide Improvement Plan is not satisfactory.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Gadsden Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of families with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents/families of migratory children.

Where is it available?

We will distribute the policy in July during the scheduled Open House. For families unable to attend the policy will be sent home with students with other documentation distributed during the Open House. The policy will also be posted on the school website. Gadsden Elementary is Reaching Out!

Gadsden Elementary will take the following measures to develop a partnership with families to help children achieve state academic standards as well as promote and support families as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:
