### Some reminders about school policy when children are going to miss some or all of a school day:

-If your child will be going home in a different manner than usual, please send a note to the teacher in advance. Students will not be allowed to go home in a different manner during the time of dismissal. Early release ends at 3:15. After that, students may be picked up only through the car pool area.

-When your child is absent you are required to send a medical excuse or a note explaining the reason for your child not being in school.

-Students are required to wear uniforms daily. School uniforms are khaki or navy blue bottoms and white or red top. Tops must have a collar, no t-shirts allowed. All shirts must be tucked in upon arrival to school and during school hours.
