TOPIC	DISCUSSION and Summary*
Opening: Pledge Allegiance/Inspiration	Mrs. McPipkin started with the Pledge of Allegiance and read an inspiration from "Fierce Conversations" No single conversation is guaranteed to change the trajectory of a career, a company, a relationship, or a life, any single conversation can. So they should be fierce, which means honest, open feedback is crucial to growing as an organization. All parties are expected to engage in open communication in order to move your organization where it needs to go.
APPROVAL OF MINUTES:	The minutes were discussed by Council. There were no amendments to be made; the minutes were approved and filed as read.
OLD BUSINESS:	<p>Mrs. McPipkin reported that GMAS Predictions were looking very good based on the raw MAP data across the grade levels. The PLCs, Academic Coach and administration are working to focus on reading and writing by incorporating strategies in the training that will address these concerns. Small groups are focusing to increase comprehension for all subgroups to ensure that we are moving students from each group to the higher group. These small groups helps with differentiation and targeting the skills that each group needs to move forward.</p> <p>Our business partners with Vaden Chevrolet of Pooler and the Junior League of Savannah were discussed. They will continue to support us throughout this year and next year. Vaden will be providing us with another \$10,000 for a cow and we will continue to work together. Junior League of Savannah has brought us a large supply of school supplies to share with our teachers and our students.</p>
PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:	Our preliminary GMAS scores are looking very promising. It looks like we will meet our reading benchmark goal and our content mastery scores have increased by almost 20 points in all subjects. MAP math scores look great. Second grade which has only been taught through the Eureka Math curriculum have an 85 % mastery on MAP. ELA MAP scores have come up so we are hoping that this will transfer to our GMAS scores. We are still waiting

	<p>for GMAS scores to come in completely. Retest scores and FAY students will affect our overall scores.</p> <p>More information will be shared at the first meeting next year. We feel that Pooler is continuing to move forward by amazing our data and addressing the needs. We will be getting Title I back for the 2019-2020 school year which will help us to address these areas for all students in our school</p>	
OTHER REPORTS:	<p>Title I input. Mrs. McPipkin discussed the process of the Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CAN) and writing the School Accountability Plan (SIP) which we ask input from parents, teachers, staff members and community partners so we asked that they share input with us about the areas that they feel we need to address. The parents and the community partners filled out the Survey that we are using to meet the needs out our students through our SIP.</p>
